NOTABLE CASES

Prosecution:

R v P (2022): Trial resulting in a conviction of an individual who had perpetrated domestic abuse against his previous partner, subsequently sentenced to 3 years' custody.

R v H (2022): Prosecuted an individual convicted under the Terrorism Act for possession of prohibited articles in custody.

R v W (2021): Successfully prosecuted a case involving child abduction, for which the Defendant received a 4 year custodial sentence.

Defence:

R v H (2022): Suspended sentence of 12 months' custody in a case involving production of indecent videos of a minor; starting point as per Sentencing Guidelines 6 years.

RvJ(2022): Acquittal of witness intimidation after trial.

R v K (2022): Acquittal of being drunk in charge of a motor vehicle.

R v B (2021): Acquittal after trial in a case involving an allegation of a controlling and coercive behaviour.

R v C (2021): Acquittal of a Defendant that was tried in his absence.

S v R (2021): Successfully appealed against a sentence of immediate imprisonment following an affray, sentence subsequently suspended.

R v C (2021): Acquittal of s.20 after trial involving an alleged fight in a nightclub.

R v D (2021): 27 months' imprisonment for possession with intent to supply class A drugs; starting point as per Sentencing Guidelines 4.5 years.
